Painted Turtle

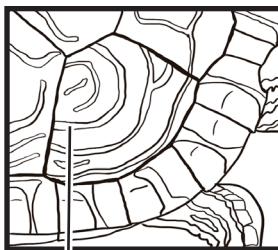
Smaller fast turtle with a smooth carapace. Red coloring underneath carapace and on neck yellow stripes, but no red color near the ears.

Yellow-bellied Slider

Solid yellow plastron.

Sea Turtles have flippers

Land Tortises' have large domed shells and walk on their toes.



backwards "c" mark

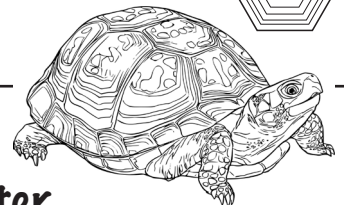
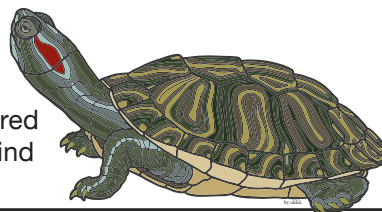
Eastern River Cooter

Has a greenish-brown with a 'c' mark that faces toward it's back end on the second scutes. It also has about 11 or more stripes on the head and neck. The plastron is reddish-orange to yellow with dark lines between the scutes that fade with age.

If the stripes on the neck are fewer than 16, then it may be a slider or cooter.

Red-eared Slider

Has a unique, broad red or orange stripe behind each eye.



Eastern Box Turtle

Eastern box turtle has a black/brown carapace with irregularly shaped blotches of yellow/orange. Eastern box turtles have a high, dome-like carapace and a hinged plastron that allows total shell closure.

Softshell Turtle

Does not have a hard carapace
 Has a flat rubbery body
 Long neck, an elongated head, and a snorkel/pig like nose
